My father died.
He is no longer alive.

Noohkom ni-maamaa teehkee awa.
This is my grandmother on my mother's side.

Ethel **kii-ishinihkaashow**.
She was called Ethel.

Ni-moshoom

Ni-maamaa **o-maamaa-wa** Ethel
kii-ishinihkaashoyiwa.
My mother's mother was called Ethel.

Ni-moshoom awa. Richard **kii-ishinihkaashow**.
This is my grandfather. He was called Richard.

Ni-moshoom William pi noohkom Margaret ookik.
These are my grandfather William and my grandmother Margaret.

Baapaa **o-paapaa-wa** William **kii-ishinihkaashoyiwa**.
My father's father was called William.

Baapaa **o-paapaa-wa** William pi **o-maamaa-wa**
Margaret **kii-ishinihkaashoyiwa**.
My father's father and mother were called William and Margaret.
