Number of players: 1+

Requires: any set of cards that has 2 of each item (food cards, awa cards, ooma cards)

Object: Collect the most matching pairs of cards.

In order to collect a matching pair you need to say a corresponding sentence in Michif that matches the picture on the cards.

Shuffle your cards and lay them out face down in a grid. Take turns flipping over two cards to see if they match. As you flip over each card, identify it using Michif (see below for ideas).

If you have a pair, say that you have two of the item. Remove the cards from the playing area and stack in front of you.

If you do not have a pair, flip your cards over again and it is now the next person's turn.

Aeñ liivr ooma. This is a book.

Aeñ liivr ooma miina. This is a book too

D-ayaan deu lii liivr. I have two books

Aeñ minoosh awa. This is a cat.

Noo peeyakwan! Not the same!

Aeñ minoosh awa miina. This is a cat too

D-ayaawaawak deu lii minoosh. I have two cats.

Sit en peer! It's a match!

* note that cards in Michif are "awa". In this game we are referring to the item on the card and not the card itself.

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
